Spike in theft of number plates

THE incidence of thieves breaking into and stealing from vehicles increased by 39 per cent last financial year, according to the latest police statistics.

Queensland Police Service's annual statistical review revealed the spike in the offence, with 2938 reported cases in the Logan District between June 2010-June 2011.

Logan Central officer-incharge, Senior Sergeant Mike Pearson, said a great number of those offences related to the theft of number

He said police had a number of persons of interest under investigation for number plate thefts around the Loganlea area.

"Near the Loganlea rail station and the hospital, the area is probably one of the worst for number plate thefts," he said.

"People leave their cars for long periods of time, so I would encourage them to leave their car in a high-

visibility area. The other thing is to have one-way screws installed into your number plates.'

Snr Sgt Pearson said by contacting Logan's District Crime Prevention Unit, they can arrange to have one-way screws installed by police.

"We are able to fit the oneway screws and they cannot be removed with a normal screwdriver," he said. With Christmas fast ap-

proaching and navigation systems, MP3 players and portable DVD players popular gifts, Snr Sgt Pearson is
